How to Report Local or State Law Violations

Report suspected crimes, like traffic violations and illegal drug use, to local authorities. Or you can report it to your nearest state police office. Find contact information:

How to Report Federal Law Violations

Report suspected violations of federal law to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)

- If you are in a foreign country, contact the nearest legal attaché office.

File a Protection Order

State courts issue protective orders

These legal orders demand that your abuser:

- Stops hurting or threatening you
- Stays a certain distance away from you

The process for obtaining a protective order differs from state to state contact the state, county, or municipal court

Crime Victims Compensation Program

To file a claim for benefits under the Crime Victims Compensation Act, you will need to complete a <u>Crime Victims Application for Compensation</u> form. You can obtain the form at any of these locations:

- Idaho Industrial Commission offices
- Law enforcement agencies
- Prosecuting attorney offices
- Hospitals
- Victim advocate group



Idaho Address Confidentiality Program

If you move to a new location to escape domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, malicious harassment or human trafficking, the <u>Address Confidentiality Program (ACP)</u> can help keep your new address confidential. This is done through the use of a mail-forwarding service and substitute address. In accordance with Idaho Code §19-57, all state and local agencies are required to accept the substitute address as the actual address of the individual. Upon approval of your ACP application, your first-class mail is sent to the secure ACP substitute address and then forwarded to your new home. You can also use the substitute address for a variety of state and local government requirements, such as:

- Applying for and receiving child support
- Getting an Idaho driver's license
- Enrolling your children in public schools
- Applying for a marriage license
- The ACP can help protect you and your loved ones by keeping your physical address private, where it would appear in public records.

Idaho Hope Card

Idaho Hope Card Information

The Hope Card is a laminated card, similar in size to a credit card. It contains essential information about a valid civil protection order in a durable, easy-to-read format, such as:

- identifying characteristics of the person being ordered to "stay away",
- a color photograph when available;
- issue date of the order;
- expiration date of the order;
- and terms of the order.
